The Navy Medical College, Chattogram (NMCC) campus is designed to provide an environment of academic excellence, safety, and holistic development. Situated in the vibrant port city of Chattogram — home to the country's largest naval base and commercial hub — the campus blends modern infrastructure with the values of naval discipline.

The academic and residential facilities of NMCC have been constructed to international standards, ensuring that students can learn, live, and grow in a secure and enriching environment. From lecture halls to simulation laboratories, from comfortable hostels to world-class sports complexes, every aspect of the campus has been carefully planned to meet the expectations of both national and international students.

Academic Building: Excellence at the core

"Global knowledge, local leadership."

At the heart of the campus stands the 115000 Sq ft state-of-the-art academic building, purpose-built to accommodate all essential facilities for MBBS education.



- Lecture Galleries: Spacious, well-ventilated lecture halls equipped with multimedia projectors, interactive whiteboards, and sound systems. Each gallery is designed to seat large batches of students comfortably while maintaining visibility and acoustics.
- Tutorial Rooms: Smaller, seminar-style rooms facilitate group discussions, tutorials, and problem-based (PBL). learning These personalized interaction between faculty and students.

- Seminar & Conference Rooms: Dedicated spaces for academic workshops, guest professional lectures, and development sessions.



- Departmental Offices: Each department (Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, etc.) is provided with its own faculty rooms, labs, administrative spaces.
- Computer & IT Facilities: A fully equipped IT lab with high-speed internet access, offering digital learning resources, e-books, and access to online databases like HINARI.



Laboratories & Practical Training Facilities: Bridging theory and practice

Medical education thrives on hands-on learning, and NMCC ensures this through a wide range of modern laboratories:

Anatomy Dissection Hall: Designed to accommodate multiple groups of students simultaneously, with preserved cadavers, prosected specimens, and advanced models. This hall allows first- and second-year students to develop a clear understanding of human body structure.

- **Histology & Microscopy Lab:** Equipped with high-resolution microscopes and digital imaging systems for microscopic study of tissues and cells.
- Physiology & Biochemistry Labs: Outfitted with modern instruments for experiments and practical demonstrations on body functions, biochemistry reactions, and molecular biology.
- Pathology & Microbiology Labs: Equipped for slide preparation, staining, microbial culture, and clinical diagnostic training.









- Forensic Medicine & Toxicology Lab: Special facilities for medico-legal training, toxicology experiments, and case-based studies.
- Pharmacology Lab: Complete with models, simulations, and instruments for teaching drug mechanisms, dosage, and therapeutic practice.

Simulation Laboratory

One of the unique hallmarks of NMCC is the establishment of a Simulation Laboratory from inception — the first of its kind among medical colleges in Bangladesh.

High-Fidelity Mannequins: Simulating real-life clinical conditions such as cardiac arrest, trauma, or childbirth, enabling students to practice emergency responses.



- Virtual Reality Modules: For training in anatomy, surgery, and patient interaction.
- OSCE (Objective Structured Clinical Examination) Stations: Providing standardized testing environments to assess practical competencies.
- Skill Practice Units: Including venipuncture arms, intubation trainers, and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) dummies.

This laboratory ensures that students gain confidence and competence before interacting with real patients, thus bridging the gap between theory and practice.

The Knowledge Hub: Library and Digital Resources

The NMCC Library is envisioned as a center of academic excellence, providing access to traditional and digital resources:

- **Print Collection:** Latest editions of medical textbooks, reference works, atlases, and journals.
- **Digital Access:** Subscriptions to e-journals, BMJ, PubMed, and WHO's HINARI digital library.
- **Reading Rooms:** Spacious, air-conditioned halls for group and individual study, open late into the evening.
- **Faculty Support:** Dedicated research and reference desks to assist both students and teachers in academic work.
- **Wi-Fi Enabled:** Students can access online resources seamlessly within the library and throughout the academic building.

Located on 11.110 acres of land in close proximity to the college campus, BNS Patenga is a fully functional, multi-disciplinary naval hospital, staffed by highly skilled doctors, nurses, and paramedics. It serves as a center of medical care for naval personnel, their families, and the civilian population of Chattogram, while simultaneously acting as a rich training ground for NMCC students.

The hospital represents the Bangladesh Navy's commitment to both service and education — providing the community with advanced healthcare while equipping future doctors with the knowledge, skills, and values necessary for medical practice.

Hospital Infrastructure & Facilities

BNS Patenga has been developed to meet the dual demands of clinical service delivery and academic training.

Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction at Navy Medical College, Chattogram (NMCC) is English. All lectures, examinations, laboratory sessions, and official communication are conducted in English, while Bengali may be used in patient interactions to ensure effective communication in clinical settings. Students are expected to acquire and maintain fluency in both languages for academic and professional purposes.

Relevance for NMCC Students

For Navy Medical College, Chattogram, this standardized curriculum and calendar ensure:

- Equivalence of degree with any other BMDC-approved medical college.
- Eligibility for government service, postgraduate training, and international licensing exams.
- A balanced education that combines science, clinical practice, community health, and ethics.

The medical education system of Bangladesh is structured, rigorous, and globally recognized. By following the BMDC-approved MBBS curriculum under the affiliation of Bangladesh University of Professionals, Navy Medical College, Chattogram ensures that its graduates receive the same recognition, opportunities, and career pathways as those from the most established medical institutions in the country.

Through academic rigor, clinical exposure at BNS Patenga, and simulation-based training, NMCC adds an extra dimension of excellence, discipline, and innovation preparing its students not only for Bangladesh but for the global stage of medical practice.

Admission into MBBS Course in NMCC

Admission is on the basis of merit. Criteria prescribed by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and BMDC are followed. Applications are invited by the Navy Medical College, Chattogram (NMCC). The admission test is organized and conducted by the AFMC.

Eligibility

As decided and directed by BMDC and AFMC can be eligible to apply.

Those who have passed 'O' and 'A' level or equivalent examinations in the specified years having equivalent marks are also eligible to apply with an equivalence certificate from concern Authority.

Application Procedure

Applications are to be submitted to a government medical college as per advertisement by AFMC.

Selection of Candidates

Separate list is published by AFMC with other Army Medical Colleges. List of finally eligible candidates is duly notified through websites or daily news papers.

Medical Examination

The selected candidates will be examined by a medical board for their physical fitness. The medical board will be formed by the Principal.

Postgraduate Opportunities

After completing MBBS, graduates of NMCC will be eligible for:

- FCPS examinations conducted by Bangladesh College of Physicians & Surgeons (BCPS).
- MD/MS programs at Bangladesh Medical University (BMU) and other universities.
- Diplomas' in clinical specialties.
- International postgraduate pathways (PLAB, USMLE, AMC, etc.).

Academic Rules & Discipline

Academic rules and discipline will be governed in accordance with the policies set by the DGME, BMDC, BUP, NMCC Standing Order Procedures, and the decisions of the relevant authorities, including the Board of Trustees, the Governing Body, and the Academic Council.

NMCC upholds the Bangladesh Navy's tradition of discipline and order, which extends to all aspects of academic life:

- Attendance: A minimum of 75% attendance is required in both lectures and practical classes to qualify for professional examinations.
- Punctuality: Students must attend classes, clinical rotations, and hospital duties on time. Late arrivals may be marked absent.
- Assignments & Records: Students must complete departmental logbooks, practical notebooks, and clinical records regularly, as part of internal assessment.
- Examination Eligibility: Internal assessments, class tests, and card examinations carry weightage toward eligibility for professional exams.
- Code of Conduct: Respect for teachers, staff, patients, and fellow students is mandatory. Any breach of discipline may result in disciplinary action by the college authority.

Dress Code & Professional Etiquette

To instill professionalism, NMCC enforces a strict dress code:

- In Academic Premises & Hospital:
 - White apron/lab coat with name tag and college ID card.
 - Modest, formal attire under the coat (shirts, trousers, salwar-kameez).
- **During Clinical Rotations:**
 - Clean and ironed apron with stethoscope.
 - Formal shoes (closed).
- For Laboratory Work:
 - Safety precautions such as gloves, masks, and protective eyewear as required.
- Prohibited Items: Jeans, casual wear, flashy ornaments, or any dress deemed unprofessional.

Etiquette emphasizes respect for patients, confidentiality, and adherence to medical ethics in all clinical and academic interactions.

Research & Academic Development

NMCC encourages a research-oriented culture among students:

- Undergraduate Research: Students are guided to undertake small-scale research projects, case reports, and surveys.
- Community Medicine Projects: Fieldwork is conducted in rural and urban settings, focusing on preventive health, maternal-child care, and public health interventions.
